As we close the year, it has been an impactful opportunity to work with students at Morley Stanwood. The middle and high school teams are moving progressively toward linking behavior supports to academic achievement.

High School: We have had 80% of the high school supported students increase attendance at school and by more than 50% pass more classes with support.

Middle School: With grade level teams working to streamline expectations it has made an impact on students. Data will show that we supported 32 middle school students with check in/out support. Of those 32 students, all but 4 increase attendance and grades.
