Last month I mentioned that the ISD signed a contract with Charter Communications for increased bandwidth from the ISD to the local districts. Special Education is finalizing their CAP's for B-4 discipline and B-13 transition. Policies, procedures and targeted trainings have made for improvements in these areas for our district.

We are currently providing special education programs and/or services to 174 students. Elementary School - 100 students, (55 students with programming)
Middle School - 39 students
High School - 35 students

We also currently service 23 students with 504 Plans.

Grants

The Consolidated App has finally been approved! We have a new MDE Title Representative who is also new to her position. She is being very diligent about doing things the correct way. Line items have required to be moved or changed but we have learned a lot. Hopefully next year's grant will be released on time and we won't run into as many issues.

31aa is expected to be received in the November State Aid. It is unclear how much we will be receiving at this time. The allowable uses have been changed slightly but the main uses of this grant are supporting mental health and school security.

27k School Loan Reimbursement has ended, this grant provided repayment for monthly school loan payments. It is expected there will be a second round of this grant but the state will be hiring a third party to facilitate the grant while the district will still be in charge of making payments to the employees.

Mid-September we were awarded funds through 11bb which was a small portion relating back to GEER (State of Michigan's Governor's COVID allocation). We had around a three-week time frame from notification of the grant to the time the funds must be expended. This included getting a plan approved from MDE. We were able to purchase some great items for our buildings. The Middle School received a trailer to store and haul the new bikes in. Elementary received funds for calming kits for classrooms, soccer goals, and some fun PE equipment! In the High School some items were purchased for the weight room including a new leg press.

September 30 also marked the end of all COVID funds. October was spent doing Final Expenditure Reports (FERs) for many grants! While this funding source has run its course, I expect there will be numerous new grants on our horizon.

Finance

I do not have much to report for a Finance update. We will likely have a better picture of State and Federal funding in the coming weeks. As pupil accounting is wrapping up for the fall count, we were on target with our budgeted 960 pupils. Hopefully when we receive State Aid on November 20 I will have GREAT news to share. Fingers crossed.
