A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Schools not identified with these labels are not given a label.

- **TSI** The school has at least one subgroup performing in the bottom 25% within each applicable accountability index component.
- ATS The school meets TSI criteria and has at least one subgroup performing at the same level as a CSI school.

Our school has not been assigned any of these labels.

Key Challenges: Morley Stanwood Middle School continues to focus on improving overall M-STEP proficiency rates in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Addressing proficiency gaps among Students with Disabilities and Economically Disadvantaged students remains a priority. Our staff is engaged in professional development aimed at refining instructional practices and supporting students from diverse backgrounds or those with a history of trauma.

Morley Stanwood Middle School is dedicated to fostering a positive, nurturing, and engaging learning environment. We are committed to academic and mental health support, ensuring highly qualified educators, utilizing para-educators to support students, and maintaining a curriculum aligned with state standards.
